Coaching News – Coaching Ideas

QUESTIONING

Questioning is a coaching strategy that poses problems for the players to solve enabling the player to learn. It also allows the coach to evaluate the players understanding and awareness. Questions that are open ended where there are a number of possible answers are more effective at enhancing learning and research suggests that when a player has to arrive at a solution themselves they take ownership and remember more of what was learned. Practicing

questioning is important - the more you do the better you get and the better players become at thinking!

What questions to ask?
What do you.....? When is the best time? How do you? Where can you? Why do you.....?

How to ask questions:
PARADE

Probe by asking further questions to get players thinking

Adopt a relaxed non threatening environment when questioning

Re-phrase the question if misunderstanding is evident

Ask one question at a time using players' words

Direct questions to all team members, giving time for them to think about the response

Expect unexpected answers and be prepared to accept alternative solutions

Any TGfU game is great for using questions eg. Variety Ball - Page 12 Skill Dev section of NNZ Coaching Tool Kit manual

- ◆ Waiuku Netball Centre was established in 1954. We service the greater Waiuku area, from Manukau Peninsula to Otatau, Aka Aka and Waiiau Pa.
- ◆ Waiuku's season runs from May through until September to cater for their large number of school teams from Waiuku College. They have 75 teams registered in 2010.
- ◆ Waiuku caters for representative netball and has teams in Year 7, Year 8 and U15 grades.
